particularly hard. Her beloved dog Max, her faithful companion of 16 years,



Can we package 10,152 meals to provide life-saving aid for the world's most vulnerable people? We have scheduled a STOP HUNGER NOW Meal Packaging event for May 22, 2016.

What is a Meal Packaging Event? It is an immensely fun, hands-on and rewarding experience for anyone of any age (4 years to 104 years). STOP HUNGER NOW delivers ingredients and supplies and volunteers set up and take down packaging stations and equipment, fill bins with raw ingredients, scoop ingredients into meal bags, weigh and seal the bags, box and stack them on pallets, and load the pallets and equipment onto a truck.

A group of 40 to 50 volunteers can package 10,152 meals in about two hours. We are inviting area



Presbyterian Churches to partner with us for the event. Currently, Antioch Presbyterian Church has agreed to join in the project. The Scouts will also be invited to participate.

How will we fund the project? The Christmas Eve service offering provided \$402.00 toward our goal. That's a start, but to continue the fundraising, you will have the opportunity to contribute each

Sunday morning beginning in March and continuing until the May 22 event. The children will be moving throughout the sanctuary each Sunday morning prior to our worship service with buckets to collect your donations. 
institution of higher education. Applicant must show evidence of acceptance in a college or university. Application forms are available in the church office and must be submitted by *May 1, 2016*.
